BOIL WATER ADVISORY LIFTED

LAWRENCE, IN – Mayor Deb Whitfield and the City of Lawrence Utilities are pleased to announce that the boil water advisory issued on March 15, 2025 for the City of Lawrence has been lifted, effective immediately.

Following thorough testing and analysis of water samples by our outside laboratory, it has been confirmed that the water is safe for consumption and all normal uses.

Therefore, residents in the affected area are no longer required to boil their water before using it for:

- Drinking
- Cooking
- Brushing teeth
- Preparing baby formula
- Other consumption purposes

Do I need to flush my pipes?

No additional flushing is required. Your regular water use—such as showering, doing laundry, and flushing toilets—has already kept water moving through your system.

If you have an automatic ice maker, we recommend discarding any ice made during the advisory and allowing it to produce fresh ice.

We appreciate your patience and cooperation during this advisory. We understand the inconvenience this may have caused, and we are committed to providing safe and reliable drinking water to our community.
